

Here is the story from a TYRO that is working to become a firefighter.

Ron, today I had my interview for Toledo Fire department...former Mayor Mike Bell he's the chief. He personally asked me to apply so today was a huge paradigm shift so now I'm getting ready to go to school for EMT. God is so good, Ron, and I wanted to personally thank you for helping me change my life so now I feel like I owe it to my community to do whatever I can to help protect them. I love my city so much and I feel like this is my due diligence. This is not negotiable without people like you in my life I don't know if I would've ever changed my life, so thank you for helping me save my life now I have the ability to try to help others because honestly what's the point of being alive if we can't help others?

We have another testimony from a TYRO from the WORTH center.

I met with the program while I was a resident at the WORTH center in January of 2020. I was a lost woman, child, mother, and sister. I had no morals that I stood for let alone practice in my life. I enrolled into the TYRO Moms program out of a combination of being bored and feeling something had to be better than doing nothing. I started to learn the value of what a mother was and the morals plus values that I would be passing off to my children. When I was charged with a drug charge and sent to that facility, I really thought this would be my life. Years of bouncing in and out of jail resulted in heading to prison. When I left the WORTH center, I took what I learned from that program. What I learned pulled me back from the relapse that I found myself in. I reached out for help and now 2 and a half years later I am a woman worth following. I battled cancer at the beginning of my recovery and maintained my sobriety. I know I have my CDCA license and work as a housing coordinator in a treatment facility.

The Power of TYRO – One TYRO's Story

Here is the story of a TYRO Peer Facilitator located at Grafton Correctional Institution (GCI). He first became a TYRO at Richland Correctional Institution (RiCI) in Mansfield, Ohio. TYRO Dad's made such an impact that he became a regular participant in the TYRO Alumni Community (TAC) there. In 2021, he was transferred to Grafton Correctional Institution. After he arrived, he sought out participation with the GCI TAC. Several months later, RIDGE began delivering TYRO Leadership under the DOJ CAREERRS grant. This grant relied on peer facilitation at GCI. He sought out the opportunity to become a TYRO Peer Facilitator. He was accepted and trained and began delivering TYRO Leadership to other residents in 2022, where he taught for about a year.

In the summer of 2023, he was transferred to GCI's specialized subdivision called the Grafton Reintegration Center (GRC). GRC is an incarceration environment specially focused on preparing non-violent residents who are near release for re-entry. When he arrived, there was no TYRO programming at the specialized camp. However, because of his enthusiasm for TYRO Programming, he began asking institutional staff if there was any opportunity to teach TYRO. He subsequently discovered that there were approximately 50 TYRO books that had been stored in a closet several years ago. Without any funding or grant project support, he sought out the opportunity to teach TYRO. He was authorized by staff to use the books and began teaching. He created nearly 50 TYRO completers before the institution made a request to purchase more books, bringing the unusual situation to the attention of The RIDGE Project and TYRO Support Services. His efforts have resulted in TYRO Leadership being recently integrated into GRC's new recovery unit.

His journey highlights TYRO Programming's impact. However, his life hasn't been changed simply because of the curricula, but also because of the way TYRO forms community. For him, the impact resulted from the value he experienced as a result of participation in the community. He experienced the consistency of the TYRO experience in multiple institutions. This is part of the reason he has the confidence to promote TYRO, even in places where it isn't currently being offered.

In 2023, we taught TYRO in 20 of the 29 prisons in the state of Ohio. From 2016 to present, we have serviced TYRO programing in 40 facilities, including CBCF's. Over 24,000 men have been through the TYRO program!

TYRO Family Impact

TYRO TALKS



The TYRO Talks speaking series was launched in 2022 through the generous support of Larry and Karen Stearns. The mission of TYRO Talks is to inspire, empower, and bring hope to men to live out the TYRO principles including honor, righteousness, and virtue. TYRO Talks is a platform for speakers, including TYROs that have achieved success since coming home, inspirational businesspeople, and community leaders. Through their stories of perseverance, achievement, and determination, speakers have challenged thousands of incarcerated men across Ohio to live up to their highest potential.

TYRO Entrepreneurship Program

The RIDGE Project recently completed its first TYRO Entrepreneurship Program (TEP) at the Richland Correctional Institution. The TEP was funded by the Frameworks grant. Through this program delivery, 22 men received entrepreneurship training over a six-month period. During the course of the training, many of the men made actual plans to begin their reentry journey with a focus on starting a small business as either a complement or an alternative to their goals for post-release employment.



The program culminated in a Pitch Night Event on March 12th, 2024. During the event, four men pitched their business concept to four entrepreneur judges. The judges were all successful businesspeople from around the state. Financial awards for the participants came from private funding. The judges awarded a prize for Best Business Presentation and a prize for Best Business Concept. The financial awards ranged from \$500 to \$1500. All four participants received at least the minimum award for their participation.

All of the participants will receive their funds and additional business startup support over the next year from Case Managers and collaborative partners located in the various communities where the participants live. This year's finalists came from locations as diverse as Cleveland, Canton, and Toledo, Ohio.

PEER FACILITATED DELIVERY

Peer Facilitated Delivery supported with professional Case Management at Richland Correctional, Grafton Correctional and North Central.

Peer facilitated classes expand our reach and provide services to individuals that don't qualify for grant funded delivery.

In these prisons, we have:
Richland – 8 Peer facilitators
North Central – 9 Peer facilitators
Grafton Correctional – 9 Peer facilitators




Since 2018, Grafton and Richland have completed 1,039 TYROS through non-grant funds.




Faith Based Contract

TYRO Keeping FAITH Contract features the TYRO Man of God (MOG) curriculum. This ODRC contract allows us to teach TYRO the way it was originally designed to be taught. TYRO MOG focuses on Biblical principles that encourage an ever-increasing faith in God and a like-minded community that provides celebration and accountability. TYRO Keeping FAITH is currently serving six different ODRC prisons, helping men become the Men of God they were designed to be. TYRO Keeping FAITH program has five intentional components. First, participants will take our ten-week TYRO class that is steeped in Christian values and Biblical principles. This class is designed to deepen your faith in God as participants explore their purpose and the love God poured into creating us intentionally for this time. Next, program completers will have the opportunity to participate in our TYRO Accountability Community (TAC). TAC is a small-group format designed to provide support, encouragement, resources, and accountability while inside. Once released, TAC connections are made to TYROS from around the country who continue their journey as men and women worth following. Third, participants will underpin the value of family by participating in family events approved by the institution. Fourth, we will offer CORE/Couple Communication, a four-week class that empowers TYROS to communicate effectively and efficiently in every area of their lives. Lastly, after completing TYRO Keeping FAITH participants will have at their disposal a myriad of aftercare services, including, but not limited to, intentional referrals, case management, mentoring, networking, job referrals, and community connections. THIS PROGRAM IS DESIGNED FOR ALL TO PARTICIPATE AND EXPERIENCE PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL GROWTH. EVERYONE IS WELCOME, REGARDLESS OF FAITH, RELIGION, RACE, GENDER, OR SECURITY STATUS.



We have served 13 classes at 6 facilities, graduating 96 TYROS in 2023!

2023-2024 YOUTH DIVISION

- Hosted film camp at Youth Treatment center for 24 adjugated youth.
 We partnered with Tramaine Hall to deliver a powerful motivational message to the youth to help encourage them to keep making progress toward healthy relationships.
- Served in the Metropolitan areas of, Dayton, Atlanta, and Dallas
- November 2023 Hosted an all-day event at the Northwest Ohio Juvenile Detention Center to celebrate Thanksgiving
- Served 25 Counties in Ohio
- · Received two new youth grants funded through HHS
- TYRO Reset: Focused on justice impacted youth and will involve partners in Georgia, Michigan, and Ohio
- TYRO Youth Collaborative: concentrates on youth in Ohio and is a collaborative partnership with three other organizations.
- Ohio Youth Congress (OYC), started a mental health campaign,
 Students write positive messages on sticky notes and place them on the lockers at their school. The feedback has been positive from both students and teachers at the schools.
- Completed our TYRO Youth On Demand Grant that focused on reaching online gamers.



We are excited to begin a new project. We will be working with incarcerated fathers and their children at Grafton Correctional. The youth will have the opportunity to meet with their incarcerated parent and walk through the TYRO Youth Curriculum. The Goal of this project is multifaceted. We want to engage youth in a positive youth development program, as well as encourage parent participation. For these fathers, it will be an opportunity to "parent" their children, creating strong relationships despite the barrier of incarceration.

YOUTH IMPACT

A student at Lucas County Youth Treatment Center (YTC) was very disengaged at the beginning of our film camp. However, by the end of the week he was leading his group with enthusiasm and a positive attitude. The reports from the staff were encouraging, because since being at YTC he had not fully engaged and was very hard. TYRO facilitators took their time with him, understanding what it took to break his tough shell and allow his true self to shine through. This young man has been a leader for his peers and an example for all YTC students to follow. In February of 2024 he was selected, by the staff of YTC, to speak to the Federal Project Officers for the Ohio Department of Health SRA Grant, virtually. This young man displayed such poise and professionalism in his answers and how he presented himself. He is a true warrior, a TYRO through and through.





Spent on Management and Administration (that's 5.8% of what we spent on Adult and youth services)


\$224,979
